Parent Voice Survey 2017



Thank you to all of you who completed our Parent Voice Survey, online during February this year. There were 209 responses. Below is a summary of what the survey told us and what actions we shall be taking:

Survey I. My child is happy at this school	Strongly agree /Agree 95%

The above results show a very positive response once again – thank you.

There's been a large increase in question II since last year (+10%), which I believe is due to staff and parents having a greater knowledge and understanding of the Government's new assessment procedures.

Homework results continue to fluctuate year on year, despite the school seeking the views of all stakeholders last year and adapting our policy accordingly. I feel this is an area that is always going to be positive for some and not for others.

There were some incredibly positive comments from parents again – thank you. A selection of these can be found on our website.

We also asked you what you thought we still needed to improve. These comments have been looked at and prioritised and we shall look at these through our Parent Forum.

I have arranged for our 1st **Parent Forum** to be held in school at **6.30pm on Monday 22nd May** with a focus on **parking**. Local residents have been asked for their views and solutions about parking and I shall share these with you at the forum. Residents will not be in attendance at the meeting. I would really appreciate your support in trying to find some solutions to this ongoing problem.
