The Learning Conferences - TLCs

To the Parents / Carers of Elm Class,

We would like to invite you to attend your child's Learning Conference. This replaces the more traditional 'Parents Evening'. These take place twice a year in our school. For our new families, a leaflet detailing the process is available from your child's teacher or on our school website.

The Learning Conference is a meeting between the teacher, child **and** parent/carer to discuss your child's progress and to set targets for improvement. You will gain a clear understanding of exactly how your child is achieving at school and what they need to improve further. This will enable you to support them with the next steps in their learning. A report detailing their progress so far this year will also be provided at the TLC. Further explanation about this report can be found on the reverse of this letter. To enable you to engage fully with the TLC process, a crèche will be available for siblings in the Acorn Room. The school's open door policy allows for any other issues to be discussed as they arise. Please feel free to arrange a separate appointment with your class teacher if you have any concerns you would like to discuss.

We will be holding The Learning Conferences on Monday 9th October between 3.20pm and 6.20pm and Wednesday 11th October between 4:20pm and 7:20pm. **Please note – All After School Clubs will not be running this week.**

TLC – Progress Report

At the conference, Years 1-6 will receive a progress report. This year is the 2nd year of reporting under the new assessment framework. The new curriculum is more rigorous and sets high expectations which all schools have had to work hard to meet since 2014.

Higher expectations means that fewer children will now **exceed** the standard expected for their year group. The majority of children are expected to achieve the required standard (**expected**) by the **end of the year**.

Through our consultation with parents we've designed a format which we hope will give a clear explanation of the standard your child is working at. This is the **Attainment** section.

ATTAINMENT	
Attainment Band	Year Group Colours
<p>This tells you how your child is achieving. Each year group is represented by a colour which is considered to be age related by the end of the year. Each year group is also broken down into 6 stages. Not all children will be working at their year group stage, so we use progress as an important measure of a child's achievement too. At this stage in the year, exceeding+ for the previous year group is considered to be age related.</p>	Year 1

It's important for parents to know, not only the stage their child is working at, but also how much **progress** they are making. Children are expected to make 6 steps of progress a year (4 or 5 for Year 1). This means a child may not yet be at **expected** but is making good **progress**. At this point in the year **3 steps** of progress is expected.

<p>The school expectation is that a child will progress 6 steps a year from their individual starting point. At this stage in the year, 3 steps would be expected. Information about progress is gathered by teachers 4 times a year so we can quickly pick up if a child is not progressing enough. Some children will make accelerated progress which means they will make more than 6 steps.
