Weather permitting, we shall have Sports Day during the first week back. This is a wonderful family day and we do hope you can join us for part or all of the day.

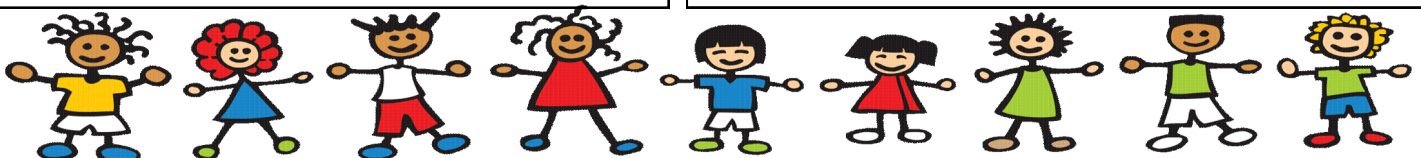
As the weather does improve, we ask that children apply suncream before school and bring an appropriate sunhat/cap. Children still need to wear sensible school shoes - no sandals please.

Please continue to check your children's hair regularly. If you would like an information leaflet, these are available from the school office. Alternatively, please check the [NHS website](#) for information.

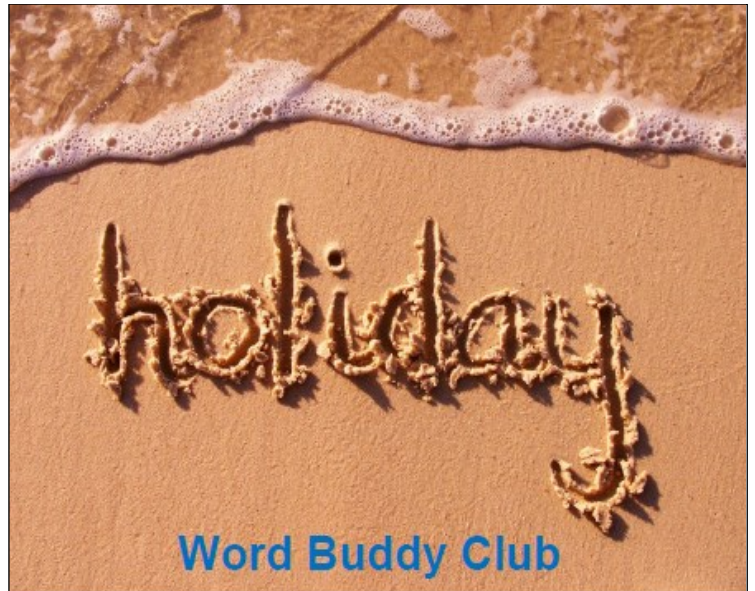
