Maths

Topic - Europe with a focus on Italy

This term our topic is Europe with a focus on Italy, we will begin by focusing on Europe. Here are some activities to get you started:

- Activity 1 – Travel Brochure about Europe and the different places that you can visit. Some things to include:
 - Variety of countries & cities (you can decide how many and which but you must include Italy and Britain) remember to include popular attractions
 - Reasons why people may visit
 - Population
 - Weather (climate)
 - Location in Europe (can you find it on a map)
 - Physical features (volcanoes, lakes, rivers, mountains etc)
- Activity 2 – Choose a European country of your choice and research in detail to complete the fact file, you can use the template provided or find another way to present your research.
- Activity 3 – Label the maps with the countries of Europe and their capital cities, or use Google Maps to find them.
- Activity 4 – Create a geography fortune teller; there is a template to guide you. You can make your own and choose which countries and cities you want to include.
- Activity 5 – Create a European flag of your choice using a variety of materials in your home. You can sketch and colour your flag if you wish.
