Maths

English

This week in English we are going to focus on a finding tale called 'The Game'. There are a variety of activities for you to complete this week so that you understand the tale very well! Rather than completing all of the activities in the booklet in one go, we would like you to complete the following activities this week. Please do not feel that you have to print the booklet out; you can do the writing part of each lesson straight into the exercise book you were given, just write the date the lesson title for each piece.

- Lesson 1: Reading focus (Pages 1 – 7. Stop at the end of the story)
- Lesson 2: Vocabulary & Response to text focus (Pages 7 – 10. Start from 'What Do the Words Mean?')
- Lesson 3: Reading Comprehension focus (Pages 11 – 13)
- Lesson 4: Grammar Focus (Pages 14 – 15)
- Lesson 5: Warm Up Writing (Pages 16 – 17. Stop at the top of page 17 after changing the verbs.)

Please continue to use Spelling Frame to practise, and practise the year 5 spelling words, they are in your home learning book.

Topic - River Deep, Mountain High

This term our topic is River Deep, Mountain High and thinking of where in the world would we like to travel and why. We will locate the world's countries, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, and major cities. We are beginning with rivers. We have included a map of the World in this pack to help you.

- Challenge 1 – research facts about the Amazon River
- Challenge 2 – research facts about the Mississippi River
- Challenge 3 – Write, draw a diagram or create a model showing some key points of river formation. <https://sciencestruck.com/how-are-rivers-formed>
- Also use the key facts you have learnt to explain what rivers are used for.
- Challenge 4 – locate 10 rivers of the world using a map and add them to the blank map this pack, what colour will you use to show each and don't forget to label them.
- Challenge 5 – Create a leaflet about a river of your choice; remember all the features we used before.

- It can include: Where the source and mouth are, how long it is, countries it flows through, what people use the river for, are there any negative impacts on your river?

Have fun with your learning and remember we expect the same quality of learning and presentation for home learning as school learning.
