## <u>English</u>

This week in English we are going to focus on a text called 'Amazing Aliens'. Rather than completing all of the activities in the booklet in one go, please just complete the following activities this week:

- Lesson I: Reading and Vocabulary Focus (Page I-5) Identify key words and have a go at creating your own alien words
- Lesson 2: Reading Comprehension and vocabulary focus (Page 6-7) Check your understanding of the text and experiment with adjectives
- Lesson 3: Writing application (Page 8-9) Have a go at the 'Talk like an Expert' game and answer some questions about aliens. Then apply this to your writing, thinking of questions you could ask an alien too.
- Lesson 4: Writing focus newspapers/headlines (Page 10-11) Use your imagination to continue the newspaper article and to create some headlines for the images.
- Lesson 5: Writing application newspapers (Page 12-13) Use the 5 W's (Who, What, Where, When, Why) to write a new paragraph. Using the images from PII, write some quotes from the different characters.

\*Please continue to practise your spellings on Spelling Frame. We will change your focus words every Monday.

## Topic - Europe with a focus on Italy

This week we are going to continue our focus on Italy. You might want to use your exercise book to make notes for Activity I and 3.

• Activity I – Geography/English: Choose an Italian city and find out what their current weather is. Create a weather report for this city. You can choose to present this as a poster, a presentation or on iMovie.

 Activity 2 – Design and Technology (DT)- Pretend you're an Italian chef as you draw and design a pizza. Write down how you would make your pizza whilst making sure your instructions are clear and in the right order so that someone would be able to follow along. What toppings would you choose? Maybe you can change the pizza for someone who was vegetarian or had allergies to certain foods like cheese or gluten? (Cauliflower crust?) Remember to write down what you would need to do to make sure you are safe and hygienic in the kitchen!

Extension: Why not try making your pizza? Here are some easy recipes to make a pizza dough which you can then adapt to make your own pizza. Don't forget your food safety and hygiene and make sure an adult is supervising you!

What can you find out about it? (For example: When was it built? Who built it? What is it made out of? Why was it built? What was/is its purpose?)
- Activity 4 DT- Using materials in your house, see if you can make a model of one of the Italian buildings from Activity 3. Take a photo of it!
- Activity 5 Celebrate VE day by completing one of the following activities:
  - Create a Union Jack flag or bunting to put up in your windows or house
  - Host a family picnic (only with the people you live with ) in your house or garden
  - Design a new VE day medal
  - Make a newspaper front page to celebrate the anniversary *or* try to recreate what you think the newspaper front page would have been 75 years ago
