Maths week beginning 27/04/2020

- Lesson I Multiply 2-digits (area model)

- Lesson 3 Divide with remainders
- Lesson 4 Calculate perimeters remember the shapes are not to scale so measuring them won't help. To find the perimeter of a rectangle or square you have to add the lengths of all the four sides together. Remember if it's a composite shape or compound shape you must add all the sides and some of those lengths will need to be calculated first.

## <u> Topic - River Deep, Mountain High</u>

This term our topic is River Deep, Mountain High and thinking of where in the World would we like to travel and why. We will locate the world's countries, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, and major cities. This week we are focussing on Volcanoes.
