You are doing so well with your home learning. It plays a vital role to help you consolidate, reinforce and extend your skills and understanding. It also provides a wonderful opportunity for you to work together with your parents/carers. So keep going – resilience is the key!

<u>Maths</u>

You are a child during World War 2. You live with your mother, father and sibling. Everybody in your house was issued with a ration book to buy food products.

- Lesson I calculate how much of each item you can buy each week
- Lesson 2 calculate how much money you would spend during a weekly shopping trip
- Lesson 3 create a menu for the week on a limited budget
- Lesson 4 calculate the cost of your menu for 4 weeks
- Lesson 5 investigate how could you make your menu cheaper

<u>English</u>

Writing: For the next few weeks we will be using the booklet 'The City of Silence' to get our creative juices flowing. There are 15 different activities what will give you the opportunity to have fun, be imaginative and adventurous in your writing.
