This week in English we are going to be completing some imaginative writing tasks based on a short, animated film called Broken: Rock, Paper, Scissors. When you complete each task, think about the quality of your writing and show us your best writing skills.

Topic - River Deep, Mountain High

This term our topic is River Deep, Mountain High and thinking of where in the World would we like to travel and why. We will locate the world's countries, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, and major cities. This week we are focussing on Oceans and Water.

- Challenge 1 – Recap the water cycle - draw and label a diagram.
- Challenge 2 – Research the five oceans of the world.
- Challenge 3 & 4- Fieldwork skills – water usage.
- Challenge 5 – Layers of the earth – draw and label the layers.
