## Subject: Maths

This week we are learning about position and direction.

Children use the language 'full', 'half', 'quarter' and 'three quarter' to describe turns made by shapes/objects. Children should practically turn objects, shapes and themselves in different directions but do not need to describe the direction of the turns. Children should investigate whether they can finish facing the same direction if they complete different turns.

Children use 'left', 'right', 'forwards' and 'backwards' to describe position and direction. They will describe the position of objects and shapes from different starting positions. You could use board games such as Snakes and Ladders and Twister to explore positional language.

## Subject: English

This week we will be focusing on the story 'Sir Lilypad' by Anne Kemp. We will be rewriting part of frog's journey. The story Sir Lilypad links nicely with maths using directional language. You can listen to the story by following this link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gaXpdnpZJDM
