Read the text. Answer the questions then check your answers. Challenge yourself as you choose the correct level for you	Choose from these suggestions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Create a Fact File or information text about wildlife in the garden you design.</li> <li>• Create an advertisement to encourage people to visit your garden – this could be a poster or an audio/video advert.</li> <li>• Write a persuasive letter to persuade the owner of the land you are using to allow you to make the garden</li> <li>• Write a letter to shops/garden centres etc asking for resources to make your garden eg plants, wood, pebbles</li> <li>• Create a guide for your garden – again this could be a leaflet, audio or video guide.</li> <li>• Create a word search or other word puzzle using plant and animal vocabulary</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Using your garden plan and measurements, calculate the area and perimeter of your garden.</li> <li>• Looking online at the price of wood and fencing, work out how much it would cost to put a fence around the garden.</li> <li>• Would you want to buy anything else? What is the total cost.</li> <li>• How much would it be with 15% discount?</li> </ul> Alternatively- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If the perimeter is 12 metres, what could the area be? How many alternatives can you think of (it can be any shape)</li> <li>• “If you double the perimeter, the area doubles” Is that sometimes, always or never true? Prove it!</li> </ul>	Your challenge for this week is to design a wildlife garden, similar to the one we are working on in school. Remember you do not have to make the garden, just design it. You will need to consider: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The size of the garden</li> <li>• What plants and animals do you want to attract? You will need to research this.</li> <li>• How will attract them? More research?</li> <li>• What else will be in the garden?</li> <li>• Who will use the garden?</li> <li>• What will you need?</li> <li>• How will you present your idea – you may want to make a drawing/model or a real life garden!</li> <li>• Make something that you can put into your own garden/an open space to attract wildlife</li> <li>• What is the name of your garden? How will people know?</li> <li>• We are sure you will have other ideas too!</li> </ul>
