This week we will be learning and practising letters / sounds e, u, r and also practising letters/sounds learned so far. We will be learning ck including the rule and practise reading words ending in ck. We will be learning the name of each new letter learned. We will practise reading the high frequency words to, get, got, the, put. Play Flashcards with the letters s a t p i n m d o c k. (Write the graphemes on a piece of paper and show them to your child. Can they tell you the sound and how you do the action? Today we are learning about Monday the grapheme 'ck'. Watch this clip <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cxdvWGUbD9">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cxdvWGUbD9</a> and copy the action and sound that the grapheme 'ck' makes. Write the captions - 'A dog is sick' 'Pick a cat' 'Dad can pack a cap.' Encourage your child to read them with Play Flashcards with the letters satpinmdqock cke (Write the graphemes on a piece of paper and show them to your child). Today we are learning about the letter 'e'. Watch this clip <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4TmOJh3W90w">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4TmOJh3W90w</a> and copy the action and sound that the letter 'e' makes. **Tuesday** Draw a phoneme frame like this adding one letter to each box. Use a two or three phoneme frame as appropriate. Say a word. Segment it (break it into individual sounds). Think about the first phoneme and choose which magnetic letter (if you have them) represents that phoneme. Put that letter in the first section of a phoneme frame. Repeat with the other phonemes in the word. Use the words: get, pet, pen, men, neck, peq. Play Flashcards with the letters  $\mathbf{s}$  at  $\mathbf{p}$  in  $\mathbf{m}$  d  $\mathbf{g}$  o  $\mathbf{c}$  k and  $\mathbf{c}$ k. (Write the graphemes on a piece of paper and show them to your child. Today we are learning to read tricky words 'the' 'to' 'and'. Write the words onto some pieces of paper (2 Weds copies) and play a matching game together. Can your child say the word when they turn it over and find one that is the same? Write some sentences only using graphemes learnt so far, such as 'The man is sick.' 'A cat and a kid dig.' Encourage your child to read them with you. Play Flashcards with the letters satpinmdgockcke. (Write the letters on a piece of paper and show them to your child. Can they tell you the sound and how you do the action?) Today we are learning about the letter 'u'. Watch this clip <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zXXbJ-78MBE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zXXbJ-78MBE</a> and Thursday copy the action and sound that the letter 'u' makes. Play 'Buried Treasure' by writing down these words – **sun mug cup mun dup sug** and ask your child whether the words are real of fake words. Maybe you could make up some of your own. Play Flashcards with the letters s a t p i n m d g o c k ck e u (Write the letters on a piece of paper and show them to your child. Can they tell you the sound and how you do the action?) Friday Today we are learning about the letter 'r'. Watch this clip https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6clSBUfloOA and copy the action and sound that the letter 'r' makes. Write words using the phonemes learned so far and ask your child to sound talk them.
