# What is a Myth?

A myth is a story that is not true but some people believe it. One popular myth is the Loch Ness Monster from Scotland. Scottish people often believe the monster is a modern type of dinosaur. The word “myth” comes from “mythology”. Mythology is the study of myths. Most mythology studies subjects of gods, superheroes or humans. Some historians (people who study history) think that myths were started as a way of telling true stories. Others believe that myths are only interesting stories or jokes to entertain people.
