Reading Comprehension

Why is reading comprehension important?

To be able to accurately understand written material, you need to be able to:

- (1) decode what they read;
- (2) make connections between what they read and what they already know; and
- (3) think deeply about what they have read. ...

Comprehension involves combining reading with thinking and reasoning.

Comprehension is also a life skill – you will need these skills when you are adults to help you understand an employment, mortgage and medical documents.

Recap of Reading Skills

Before you complete the reading comprehension, make sure you understand the following:

What is retrieve and copy?

To search for a particular word, phrase or sentence and to copy by writing down, the word, phrase or sentence.

What is skim and scan?

Skimming: is useful when you want to get a general idea of what a text is about. When skimming, you ignore the details and look for the main ideas. Main ideas are usually found in the first sentences of each paragraph and in the first and last paragraphs.

Scanning: rapidly covers a great deal of material to locate a specific fact or piece of information. Scanning is very useful for finding a specific name, date, statistic, or fact without reading the entire article.

What is sequence events?

The ability to retell the events within a given text in the order in which they occurred.

There are 3 reading comprehensions Levels 1-3. Level 1 is a Y6 comprehension. The majority of you should be able to do this one. If you find it is too difficult then try levels 2 or 3.

Only complete 1 comprehension.
