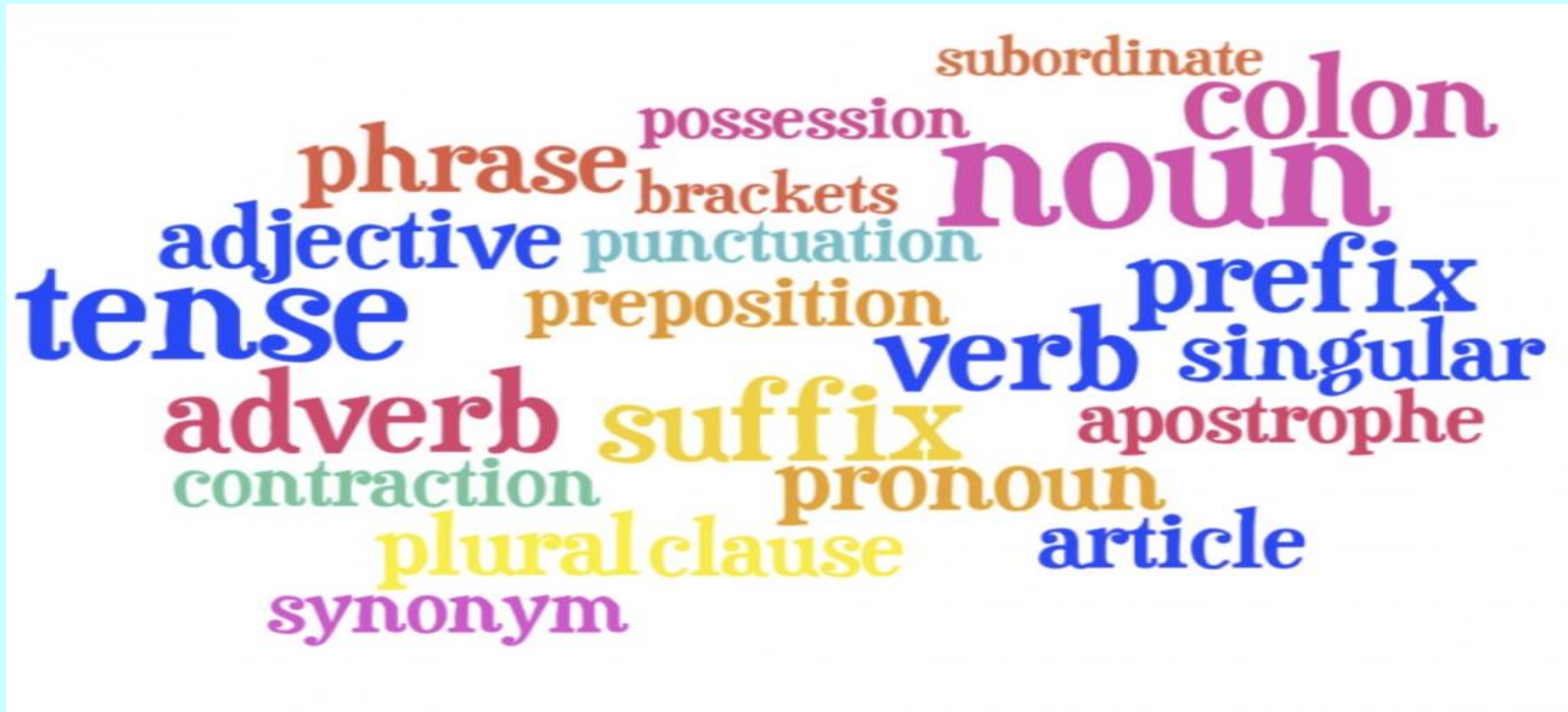

Last week – simple sentences

The man **rubbed** his stomach!



- short sentence – gives dramatic impact / evokes a feeling from the reader
- one verb
- exclamation mark emphasises feeling

This week...compound sentences



What makes this a compound sentence?

The man rubbed his stomach and licked his lips.

Coordinating conjunctions

and so but

or yet nor for

(for when you are feeling more confident)

Compound sentences pattern

Let's follow this pattern when writing our sentences.

Main clause *coordinating conjunction* main clause.

Today we will just use full stops to end our sentences.
Remember every sentence must start with a capital letter.

Take the feeling 'sad'.

Here are some compound sentence examples.

His head dropped *and* his shoulders began to sag.

Rachel's head dropped *and* she sank to the floor.

Her tears fell *so* she felt blue.

Matt's smile fell *but* he still played with his friends.

He sat alone *yet* he knew he was loved.

She was silent *for* she felt so blue.

His smile fell *and* he was silent.
