RSE/RHE

Statutory requirements

- More structured approach in teaching RHE to prepare children in an age appropriate way.
 Some of the learning that has been traditionally left until year 6 will form the year 4 and 5 curriculum.

- Statutory requirements come into effect in April 2021.

- Programme that follows statutory requirements and is updated.
- Whole school systematic approach from Nursery to Y6, this includes assembly themes.
