What are

Chinese dumplings?

traditional dish in China. A thin layer of dough (面 midn) is filled with vegetables and/or meat. In northern China on Chinese New Year's Eve (除夕 Chú XI), people often make dumplings together, although they are also made Chinese dumplings (饺子 Jiǎo zi) are a day-to-day.

Important Note: This recipe uses bailing water so make sure you ask an adult to help you.

Method:

Knead this with your hands (‡ shōu) dusting with a little flour if sticky. Stir (被牌 jido bân into the flour until odd more woter if seems dry.

Place (19 fang) some filling in the centre of each 'pancake', moisten the edges with water




O Fold the dough in half





O Pinching it together with your fingers (手語 shōu zhī)







After about twenty (=+ er sh) minutes, tear the dough into skrteen (+/x, shi lik) eq. sized pieces and flatt into round flat 'panci









How to make a paper lantern for Chinese New Year.

- 1. Cut off one end of the paper. Set aside to use as the handle.
- 2. Decorate the sheet using coloured pens, paint or glitter.
- 3. Fold your paper in half lengthwise along the dashed line.
- 4. Cut the marked lines along the sheet. (Do not cut to the edge of the paper).
- 5. Unfold the paper.
- 6. Match the long edges together on the lantern and use tape to hold it in place.
- 7. Staple the handle to the top of the lantern.

The Chinese Horoscope

In Chinese culture, each new year is shown by one of 12 animals. This tradition dates back thousands of years and started with a story. Because it is an old tale, there are many different versions of the story. Some versions have the Jade Emperor as the main character and others have Buddha. However, all of the stories are very similar and contain the same 12 animals. One version of the story tells that Buddha asked all of the animals on Earth to come and see him but only 12 animals answered his call. Buddha repaid them by giving each one of these animals their own year in the Chinese zodiac cycle.

The Year of the Ox begins on 12th February 2021. It is the 4719th year of the Chinese calendar. Once the Year of the Ox is over, the next will not begin again until 31st January 2033.

1961 1973 1985 1997 2009

Traits of the Ox

People born in the different years of the Chinese zodiac cycle are believed to have particular **traits** and qualities. These traits are said to link to the animal that the year is named after. The ox is said to be the second of the zodiac animals and is seen as honest.

Oxen are believed to be hard-working and loyal. Just like the real-life creature, people born in this year are also said to be reliable. Many people believe that individuals born in the Year of the Ox are determined people who believe in the importance of hard work.

People born in the Year of the Ox are said to get on well with those who were born in the Year of the Rat, the Year of the Snake and the Year of the Rooster.



Tireless Workers

It is said that people born in the Year of the Ox do well in jobs that require a clear routine. They are said to prefer working alone and in jobs that require a specialist skill. It is believed that other people enjoy working with people who were born in the Year of the Ox because they can be relied upon to finish jobs thoroughly.

Popular careers for people born in the Year of the Ox are said to include:

- lawyers;
- carpenters;
- bankers;
- army officers.
