use the terms BC and AC appropriately use historical language to describe the past sequence using a time line The Stone Age is the name given to the earliest period of human culture when stone tools were first used. In Britain, the Stone Age was around 12,000 years ago.



All dates are approximates!

Timelines, are often used in history to put things in order of when they happened

- We arrange our dates from the time Jesus was born:
- even though we say this is the Year 20XX, the world is actually billions of years old
- BC means Before Christ and AD means Ano Domini (in the time of our Lord)
- Higher BC number were longer ago
- Higher AD numbers are closer to now




Around 450,000 BC

- People lived in caves
- They were hunter gathers



Around 25,000 BC

The Ice Age Huge ice sheets covered the land and sea



Around 12,000 BC

• The ice Age ended



Large animals died out and smaller animals and plants began to grow in an area in the Middle East known as Mesopotamia, part of the Fertile Crescent.

Mesolithic (Middle Stone Age)


People were still hunter gathers but had better tools

Neolithic Age / New Stone Age

Neolithic (New Stone Age)



Was the final stage of cultural evolution or technological development among prehistoric humans. ... The **Neolithic** followed the **Palaeolithic** Period, or **age** of chipped-**stone** tools, and preceded the **Bronze Age**, or early period of metal tools.

From around 4,000 BC to 2,500 BC

- Pots made of clay
- Sharper tools made of flints
- House build of clay, dung and straw
- Fences made of wood
- Boats
- Lived in settlements
