

# Revise: suffixes - plurals

It is really important to revise regularly spellings that we may know, so that we remember it in the long term.

## suffix

A group of letters at the end of a word that changes its meaning

## noun

A person, place or thing

## singular

One thing

## plural

More than one thing

# Investigate and generate rules

To make these nouns plural what suffix do I need to add?

Singular = 1

Plural = more than 1

One dog

Lots of dogs

One door

Lots of doors

One pencil

Lots of pencils

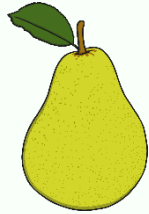
One lamp

Lots of lamps

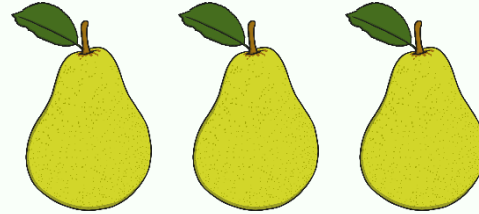
For most words we just add 's' to the end of it to change it into a plural.

Now think of 3 of your own where the rule 's' can be added to a noun to change it from singular to plural.

one pear



three pears



desk → desks

month → months

book → books

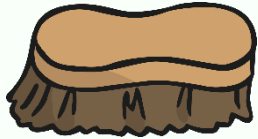
train → trains

pen → pens

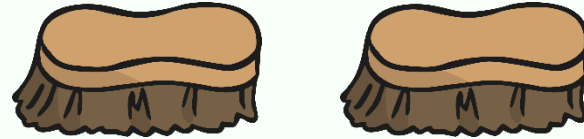
dog → dogs

To change these words in to plurals, add ...

one brush



two brushes



box → boxes

dish → dishes

glass → glasses

church → churches

If the word ends with one of these sounds...

Now think of your own noun for each sound, where the rule 'es' can be added to change it from singular to plural.

ch

ss

s

x

z

...then add 'es'
