Now watch the English learning video by Oak National Academy to recap yesterday's learning.

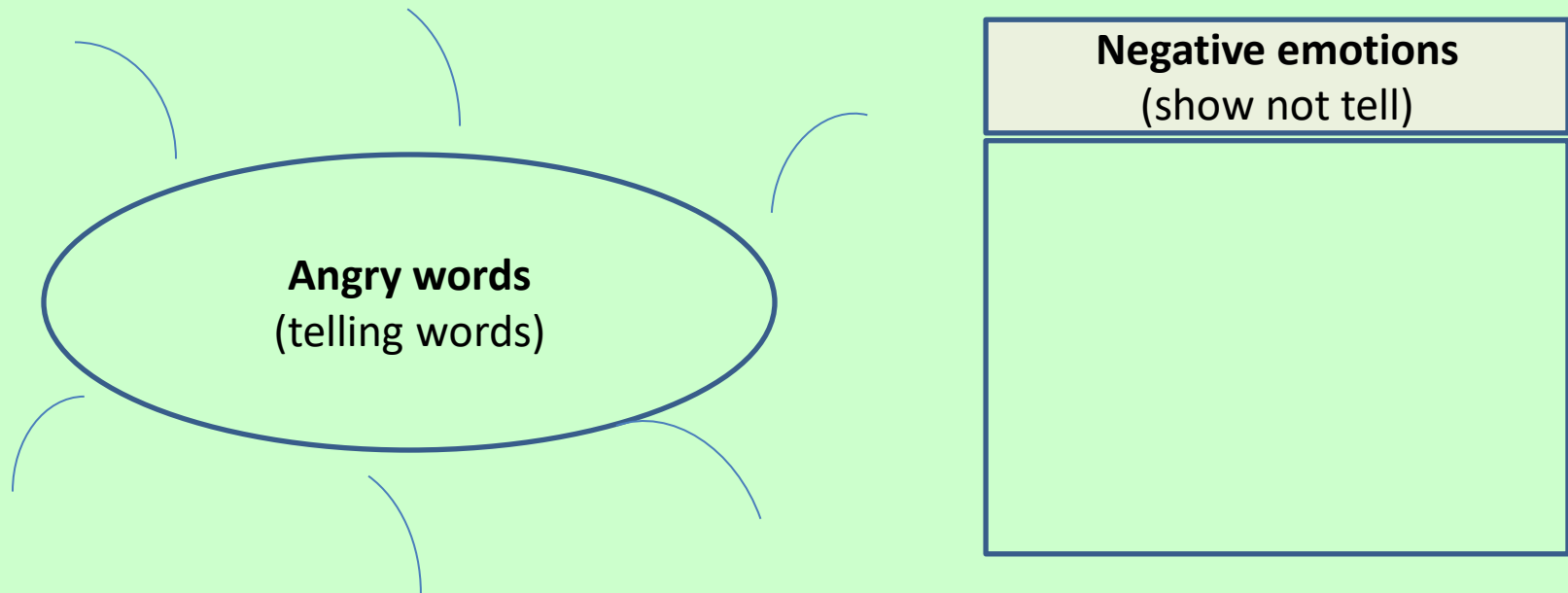
When completing today's main activity, in class we will be creating 3 mind maps for **telling** how someone is feeling:
