Answers

I have three 5p coins in my purse. How much money do I have altogether?



$$3 \times 5p = 15p$$

In a relay race, 4 children swim 2 lengths each. How many lengths are swum altogether?



$$4 \times 2 = 8 \text{ lengths}$$

4 groups of children go on a school trip. There are 10 children in each group. How many children go on the trip?



$$4 \times 10 = 40 \text{ children}$$

I buy 6 bottles of lemonade. If there are 2 litres in each bottle, how many litres of lemonade have I bought?



$$6 \times 2 = 12 \text{ litres of lemonade}$$

I plant my onions in 6 rows and put 10 onions in each row. How many onions do I plant?



$$6 \times 10 = 60 \text{ onions}$$

How many toes are there on 5 children?



$$5 \times 10 = 50 \text{ toes}$$

Challenge

3 boxes of 10 as that equals 30 which is more than 5 boxes of 5.

1. Would you rather have 3 boxes with 10 biscuits in or 5 boxes with 5 biscuits in? Explain your reasoning.

2. Would you rather have 4 trays with 5 apples in or 2 trays with 10 apples in? Explain your reasoning.

Multiplication Word Problems

×2, ×5 and ×10

Tom buys **three cinema tickets** costing **five pounds each**.
How much does he spend?

Let's look at how you would work this out.



You could add...

Each ticket is £5 so you would add 5
for each cinema ticket.

$$5 + 5 + 5 = 15$$

If you are repeating the same
number in an addition number
sentence, this is a multiplication.

$$5 \times 3 = 15$$

You can read
this as '5 three times'.

Multiplication Word Problems

×2, ×5 and ×10

Sam has **four plant pots**.
She wants to plant **two beans in each pot**.
How many beans must she buy?



Let's look at how you would work this out.

You could add...

Sam wants to plant 2 beans in each pot.

$$2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 8$$

If you are repeating the same number in an addition number sentence, this is a multiplication.

$$2 \times 4 = 8$$

You can read this as '2 four times'.

Multiplication Word Problems

×2, ×5 and ×10

Five judges each give Mark a **score of ten**.
How much did he score altogether?

Can you show this as an addition number sentence?

Check your answer

$$10 + 10 + 10 + 10 + 10 = 50$$

Can you show this as a multiplication number sentence?

Check your answer

$$10 \times 5 = 50$$

You can read this as '10 five times'.



Multiplication Word Problems

×2, ×5 and ×10

There are **six sunflowers** in the garden. Each sunflower has **five petals**. How many petals do the sunflowers have altogether?

Can you show this as an addition number sentence?

Check your answer

$$5 + 5 + 5 + 5 + 5 + 5 = 30$$

Can you show this as a multiplication number sentence?

Check your answer

$$5 \times 6 = 30$$



Multiplication Word Problems

×2, ×5 and ×10

A large taxi can carry **ten people** to the party. If **three taxis** arrive at the same time. How many people arrive at the party?

Can you show this as an addition number sentence?

Check your answer

$$10 + 10 + 10 = 30$$

Can you show this as a multiplication number sentence?

Check your answer

$$10 \times 3 = 30$$



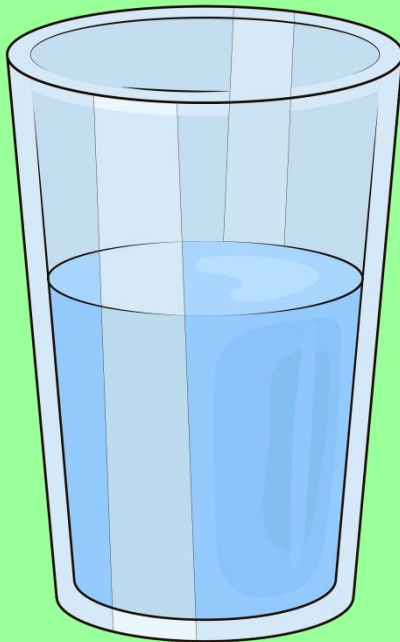

What Do Tigers Look Like?

Tigers are the biggest of the big cats. Most tigers have orange fur with black stripes. Some tigers have black or white fur with light brown stripes. The stripes help the tigers to hide from other animals when they are hunting. They have long legs to help them run fast and sharp claws to catch and kill their food. They also have a very long tail.

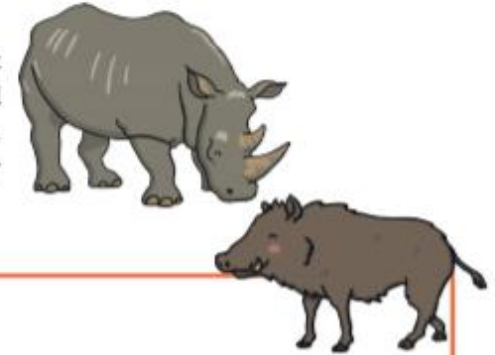


Where Do Tigers Live?
