- Use your class spelling words or any words you wish to spell.

# SPELLING MENU

#### 1. ABC Order



Write all of your spelling words in alphabetical (ABC) order.

#### 2. Word Parts

Write your words. Then use a coloured pencil to divide the words into syllables.
e.g. jumping caterpillar

#### 3. Other Handed

Write each word 5 times, switching the hand you write it with each time. Say the word as you spell it.

#### 4. Vowel Spotlight

Write your words using one colour for the vowels and another colour for the consonants.

(vowels: a, e, i, o, u)

#### 5. Use Technology

Type out your spelling words on the computer.

Try to use at least 4 different fonts.



#### 6. Pyramid Words

s p
s p e
s p e l
s p e l l
s p e l l i
s p e l l i n
s p e l l i n g
(or make them boat shaped,
star, smiley face, etc.)

#### 7."Ransom" Words

"Write" your words by cutting letters out of a newspaper or magazine and gluing the letters on a piece of paper to spell your words.



#### 8. Rainbow Words

Write your spelling words with coloured pencils.

Make each letter a different colour.



## Spelling Table Tennis

- You spell, I spell
- Find an opponent mum, brother, Grandma, friend, Alexa... etc.
- Agree on how many rounds, best of 3, 5 or 11.
- Say a word to challenge them to spell.
- Then they challenge you with a word.
- Keep going do your best.
- Then check your spellings in a dictionary or on Google
- Who is the champion?










## Taekwondo Spellings

- Write out the alphabet in a long line
- Spell your words like a taekwondo master, by crashing your hand down on each letter in turn to spell out the word.





## Cowboy spellings

- Find an opponent and a quiz master
- Stand back to back with your opponent
- The quiz master chooses a word and says one letter at a time, with each letter both take a pace forward.
- When you think you know what the word is spin around and shout out the word.
- Start with smaller words first and build up.

# Spelling words treasure hunt

- Write your words on different post it notes, one word on each post it note (paper).
- Get someone to hide them around the house. No peaking!
- Ready, get set, spelling hunt!
- Find all the spellings, read and shout out the word when you find it.



### Scrabble spelling puzzles

- Write the letters of your spelling words on individual bits of paper
- Then muddle them all up
- Can you make up the words again using the letters
- If a bit tricky, just muddle one word up at a time to rearrange









## Spelling Scibble
