

## Safety Week 7<sup>th</sup>-II<sup>th</sup> February 2022 'Staying happy, healthy & safe'



As part of the Early Years and National Curriculum, we teach RHE-Relationships and Health Education. Every 2 yea rs we run a Safety Week which covers some aspects of this Curriculum. During Safety Week we shall be covering the topics below, although not every year group will cover all topics.

The children will take part in workshops that will be led by outside professionals, covering Fire, Rail and Speak out to Stay Safe by the NSPCC. In addition to this Year Two and Six classes will also be involved in learning about First Aid and Year 6 will also take part in Crime workshops.



<u>Fire Safety</u> will be taught to all year groups and will be introduced by a visit from the Fire Service. Children will be taught how to minimise the risks of a fire and what to do if there is a fire.



<u>Road Safety</u> will be taught in the classroom, some classes may be using the local area to practise safe road crossings.



<u>Staying safe at home</u> will cover the following areas: Avoiding trips by putting toys away, not touching knives and boiling water, awareness of the dangers of overloading electrical sockets and appliances.



<u>Water Safety</u> will cover the following areas: Running near swimming pools, needing adult supervision, wearing arm bands if needed, staying safe in the bath, open water safety, tomb stoning into the sea or jumping into shallow water.



<u>**Railway Safety</u>**, Key Stage One and EYFS will discuss staying safe on platforms and near railway tracks; Key Stage Two will take part in more detailed workshops and will cover the following areas: High powered electrical lines, playing on tracks, level crossings.</u>



<u>Keeping our body happy & safe</u> will cover the following areas: Healthy eating and staying active, technology well-being, cigarettes, alcohol, medication & drugs

We are looking forward to this being an exciting and thought provoking week in school. All topics will be taught sensitively and at a level appropriate to the age of the children. However, if you have any questions about Safety Week, please talk to your child's class teacher or myself.
