The Reading Ambassadors have been asking some members of staff about what they read.



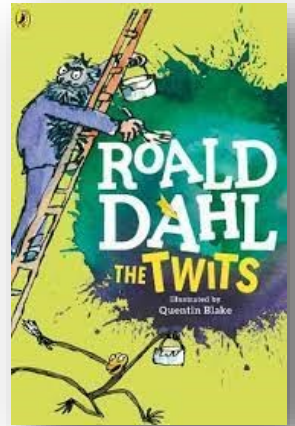
Harry and Jay spoke to Miss Taylor

Q: What is your favourite book now?

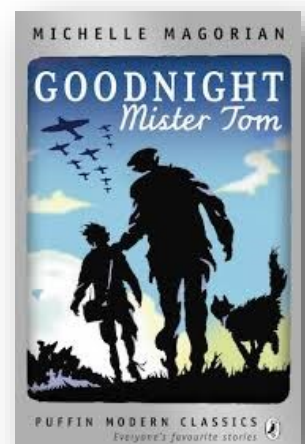
A: I like reading books by John Grisham.
